

# **Chamber's Netwalking Programme**



The Brentwood Gazette recently carried an article about Chamber's Netwalking programme. Chamber Chairman Colin Barber, at a recent Chamber Business Breakfast event, presented Sue Spong, a bereavement support counsellor from St Francis Hospice, with a donation from funds raised at our 2016 Netwalking Events programme.

Colin, whose wife Valerie sadly died in September 2015, took part in the St Francis Hospice bereavement group's 'Walk On' programme. Sue spoke about the beneficial

effects to bereaved people which could be derived from 'Walk On', both physically and psychologically to help cope with their personal tragedy.

'Walk On' also gave Colin the idea of starting up the Netwalking programme as he felt it offered a unique and informal way for people to relax and network at the same time. Each month Chamber's Netwalking event starts and finishes at a different local pub, where networking continues and non-walkers are welcome to join us.

Colin felt they were such a success this year, that he is planning a similar programme next summer.
