Brentwood office space under pressure



Chris Stewart, Director at Chamber member Mass & Co, talks about the factors affecting the available office space in the Borough:

"In 2013 continued pressure to meet Government targets for housing units throughout the South East led to the temporary extension of permitted development rights enabling office buildings to be converted to residential. This has now been extended indefinitely and has resulted in around 100,000 square feet of office space in Brentwood being lost from commercial use over the past year or so, with further such proposals in the pipeline.

"This puts upward pressure on rents for the remaining office space with a knock-on effect to occupiers, and with the lack of available space in the town a number of established companies have been looking to Chelmsford or Basildon where vacant office supply is greater. Conversely, for property owners, remaining office investments are becoming far more attractive. Ironically, this reduction in

office accommodation comes as we anticipate the opening of Crossrail in 2019, and at the same time as there is a noticeable hardening of the residential market and an increased demand for office space.

"The loss of office workers will have a significant effect on the dynamic of the town centre, putting further pressure on the many High Street shops which are feeling the effects of online shopping and of the proximity of Westfield Stratford City. To some extent this is accelerating the trend towards leisure use (more restaurants – such as Pivaz – opening) and although some big retail fashion names have expressed interest in the town, bringing deals to fruition can take a long time."

However, the painting - and my Great Uncle Jack - failed to make it back to England as he (Jack, who wrote under the name Wilson Broadbent) decided he preferred to fly to Paris to rendezvous with his mistress...I hope the other side of my family went some way towards making up for this: as part of his work as a code-breaker at Bletchley Park, my late father helped shorten the war in North Africa by around two years, thus saving many lives.


