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## It started with a sneeze – how a hobby became a business

Chamber member David Strelitz, owner of David Strelitz Video Productions, shares his fascinating and inspiring business story.



Picture the scene: 1982, David Strelitz languishes in bed, recovering from a severe bout of pneumonia. He's the manager of a dental laboratory – a specialist in dental ceramics (crowns and bridgework) at one of the country's biggest dental practices. Whilst convalescing he embarks on a new hobby and buys a video camera and recorder, with not a thought that this would lead to a major career change. "Back then, video cameras were in their infancy and cine film was still very popular," he explained.

To his surprise, requests to film events soon began to trickle in and by September 1983 he was able to form a part-time business, initially filming weddings and parties and also duplicating video tapes and transferring cine film to video. By 1987 he turned his back on dentistry and video production became David's full-time job.

# From Down's Syndrome to the West End stage

Since then, David has become an experienced, award-winning video producer who's worked across the UK and Europe and kept abreast of ever-changing technology. He's produced videos covering everything from dementia, Down's Syndrome and surgical procedures to corporate promotions and health and safety programmes, and has been hired by everyone from SMEs to PLCs.

He said: "I've filmed professional theatre productions and conferences for major organisations at venues including top West End theatres and prestigious conference venues and at wonderful locations from Monte Carlo to Milton Keynes. (OK, some are more wonderful than others...)."

'Hairy', is the word he uses to describe two particular assignments: Supervan 3 (a Ford Transit with a 3 litre Cosworth racing engine) filmed on the Ford European test track at Dunton and a reconstruction of a glider accident filmed in North Wales, which culminated in a full-scale emergency landing when the Cessna he was flying home in developed engine problems.

Filming on factory production lines over the years has allowed him to become an 'expert' on how some things are made, including how wellington boots are manufactured, how wall planners are printed, laminated and rolled for despatch, how car radiators are assembled, how jam is made in Tiptree and how bespoke, handcrafted coffins are manufactured.

### Do the burlesque

David has made many TV commercials shown on ITV, STV, UTV and Sky and even promos for a Las Vegas burlesque cabaret show. "Some jobs are tougher than others," he joked.

All these years later his cine film and video transfer service is still very much in demand from both private customers and photographic outlets, with DVD and USB sticks replacing video tapes. He offers a 'one-stop shop', providing video production in-house from script to screen. For large projects, David assembles a team of specialist, broadcast-experienced professionals, some of whom he has worked with for over 25 years.

"I consider myself very lucky. I'm doing something that I enjoy and there is rarely a day that I do not learn something new in an ever-changing technology".
