Town Link Radio gets a rebrand

The Town Link Radio scheme run by the Chamber - in conjunction with Brentwood Borough Council and Brentwood Communications - has undergone a rebrand as all parties look to spread the take-up of the network.

TLR provides security and support to businesses within the Borough of Brentwood and costs as little as £5.50 a week to join.

It aims to help to reduce stock loss, crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour, as well as supplying support for medical incidents and business continuity.

The TLR radio system is linked to local CCTV, and Brentwood and Epping Forest Police.

And other benefits include: membership of Brentwood Chamber of Commerce; communication support available 24/7; with information, incidents and requests for support shared instantly across one system.
