# Creative writing with more confidence

Chamber member Janette Collins (pictured right), author and creative writing coach, has launched a new project for 2019 - Janette's Creative Writing Academy.

After a constant pull to write a novel, Janette published her book Truth in Death in 2018 - a suspense novel about a young people pleaser, who may or may not have killed the local bar owner.

While marketing her book, Janette found that many would connect to her story. She worked in a corporate environment most of her working life, loved her work and was somewhat ambitious, but was missing a single ingredient, creativity.

The comments were often along these lines: "I wished I had done that."

"I would love to write a novel, but wouldn't know where to start."

"I have an unfinished book in my desk. I would finish it, but don't know how."

With a background in training, simplifying the most complex rules and regulations, Janette decided to create a safe and helpful environment for aspiring authors to learn and enhance their writing skills while getting into the right mindset.

"The problem most face is fear of judgment, procrastination, perfection, and



sometimes lack of support," she explained. "Many want to write, want to be published and see their book in the store window, or a number one bestseller on Amazon. But they hit what often feels like a brick wall.

"That's where Janette's Creative Writing Academy comes in. The Academy supplies online training, on all essential aspects of storytelling while helping participants get into the mindset of an author.

"The momentum it creates has seen massive changes for my dedicated clients, as early as day four. And now I am excited about supporting the next group of participants."

### Getting to know you...

Sara Porter, director of Edwards Watts Opticians in Shenfield, who joined the Chamber's Executive Committee in 2018, agreed to do a newsletter Q&A

# Tell us about your business background Sara:

I've no training in business, I was just bred into it! I learned from my predecessors and mistakes! My first management post was at 26, I worked for big companies and hated it - but took on board their good bits of management knowledge and systems.

### And all about Edward Watts Opticians?

It was established in 1958 by my father - after National Service in the RAF, he was given a desk job and hated it with a vengeance, so he went back to college and started his own business - and it moved to the present address in Chelmsford Road in the early 1960s. It was originally in Toll Bar Cottage next door. After much building work and many people we are still there.

The optical business is a unique profession as it is a mix between commercial and healthcare. And the business is unique in the optical world as we work both in hospitals and the High Street.

# What made you put yourself forward for election to the Exec Ctte?

I was asked!

# What areas are you looking to develop in 2019 with the Chamber?

I do not have a lot of spare time so I'm unable to support many events, but I'm happy to advise generally, and I'm pretty hot on the Equality Act. Born and bred in Shenfield, I know the area and its business challenges very well.

# What do you think are challenges facing your business and the Brentwood business community in 2019?

They're huge - business is changing all the time. You just think you've cracked it and the bar gets raised, such as with Health & Safety and GDPR.

Technology has moved on greatly, and that gives us a better understanding and knowledge of our eyes. But technology comes at a cost. The High Street optician is called Primary Care, hospitals are Secondary Care, and the challenge is to move patients out of Secondary into Primary - thus relieving the burden on the NHS.

Another challenge is to educate the general public to respect and understand more about their eyes, and enhance the continuity and communication you can get from the independent practitioner which as a rule you don't get in multiple chains due to the high turnover of staff.

# Lord Pickles to speak at Chamber AGM in May

Former Brentwood and Ongar MP Eric Pickles - now The Rt Hon. the Lord Pickles - has been confirmed as the main speaker at the Chamber's Open Meeting and Annual General Meeting in May.

The AGM will take place on Thursday May 16 at Brentwood Cricket Club on Shenfield Road, and as an Open Meeting welcomes non-members as well as Chamber members.

Lord Pickles is certain to have some interesting insight into current political affairs in the Borough and in Parliament, both from his time as Member for Brentwood and Ongar from 1992 to 2017, and since becoming a member of the House of Lords in June 2018.

Having had several roles within the Conservative Shadow Cabinet between 1998 and 2009, as well as being Deputy Chair of the Conservative Party from 2005-2007, he then served as Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government from 2010-2015. He was also Party Chair of the Conservative Party in 2009-2010.

Also on the agenda for the AGM that evening will be election of Chamber officials and members of the Executive Committee. To that end, we're very keen to hear from any Chamber member that would like to get involved and put themselves forward for election to the Committee in May.

The Committee meets every month, usually on the second Thursday, and is comprised entirely by volunteers from the Brentwood business community, from a range of different sectors and backgrounds.
